I wish you a very happy new year.





### **Norwegian Bishop Resists Hitler** **Presenter: John Matthews**

Pastor John Matthews will speak about the Norwegian Lutheran Bishop, Eivind Berggrav. Known for his unyielding resistance to the Nazi occupiers, Berggrav was placed under house arrest for most of the war, having spent a brief time in the Bredtvet Concentration Camp in 1942. A most interesting man and story. The Norwegian Resistance is a proud chapter during this turbulent time of European history.

### **Farvel til Gunnar** **Presenters: TOH Team**



## January 27

### **Hymn of Grace**

This is an event of great importance in Vocal art performed in Bodø, Norway. Gracia Grindal made a special trip to Norway to provide the music text. We are fortunate to have a recording of this performance and at the recommendation of Pr Gunnar Kristiansen, the video will be replayed for the TOH audience.

Hymn of Grace is a homage to the first organized group of Norwegian Immigrants who came to the USA two hundred years ago. The text to this work is written by Gracia Grindal, and the music is composed by Tore Johansen. This work was commissioned by Mindekirken, Minneapolis, and is a highlight of our church's Bicentennial celebration.



## BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE CONTINUED

(cont. from p.3) ...King's Guard made a spectacular appearance in May, singing and playing popular Norwegian hymns and other pieces. The Leif Eriksson program in October was also a wonderful time of celebration as well, thanks to Jim Reilly and Pastor Gunnar. The major event of the whole year for us was of course the visit of Crown Prince Haakon Magnus in October. He was here with Bishop Olaf Tveit to dedicate the ship. We are grateful to Leslee Hoyum for pushing to get the ship built and for arranging for a plaque with the names of those who contributed over \$1000 to the project which will hang on the back wall of the sanctuary. Pastor Gunnar has been most helpful. In September we were glad to hear the Tidløs group present their wonderful music based on Norwegian hymns. At the time of the visit of the Crown Prince, he had arranged for a dramatic performance of Doom by an actress, Wenche Strømdahl telling the story of her own experience coming to grips with a statement of her pastor saying she should not go into the theater. Along with her we also were privileged to hear the organist Petra Bjorkhaug at Nidaros Cathedral in Trondheim. She played for the performance and for the appearance of the crown prince. Then Gunnar had also asked me to write a libretto for the Vocal Arts group in Bodø on the emigration. They performed it on October 12 in the concert hall there and it was live streamed to Mindekirken where people could listen to it here. I was privileged to be at the concert in Bodø. It was one of the most beautiful experiences of my life, hearing my words and the words of familiar Norwegian hymns that the emigrants sang in their joys and troubles. The music was classical jazz composed by Tore Johansen. It will soon be published by Norsk Musikforlaget. It was also good to have Pastor Ole Amund Gillebo and his wife here for a few days. All in all the year was filled with events that helped us remember and ponder the meaning of the immigration and why we as a congregation have as one of our goals the honoring of the pioneers for their life and faith that gave us so much. Thanks to all who helped, especially the committee which included President Kris Grodahl, Nancy Olson, Marilyn Sorensen, and Pastor Gunnar! It was a wonderful year.


## FAREWELL PARTY




