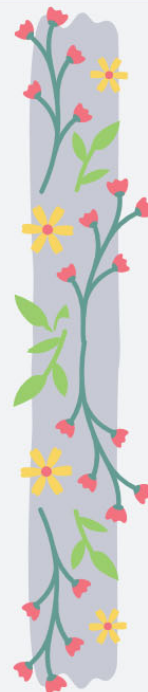

PASTOR'S HILSEN

Velkommen Pastor Tim Peterson



"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you – always, in every prayer of mine, making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the Gospel from the first day until now." Philippians 1:3-5

Eight years ago I had the privilege of being interim pastor at Mindekirken. Now I have the privilege of coming back to serve as interim pastor again. I will be starting on Sunday, February 8. I have agreed to serve through May.

The Christian faith is centered on Jesus, and the message of Jesus is very prominent in our sanctuary, with the altar painting of the Resurrection and pictures in the stained glass.

But we also have some distinctive Scandinavian emphases, such as our ship hanging from the ceiling, reminding us that we are on a voyage together with Christ. There may be storms, but Jesus is always there with us. And in the back window above the balcony there are pictures of Martin Luther and the Norwegian preacher Hans Nielsen Hauge.

I intend to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ during my time at Mindekirken. I intend to preach from the perspective of a Christian who has been inspired

by Martin Luther and Hans Nielsen Hauge. I intend to emphasize the distinctive aspects of Norwegian Christianity because that is our congregation's heritage and it is an inspiring heritage.

I am concerned about the recent events in Minneapolis. I have no idea what things will be like by February 8, my first Sunday with you, as the situation has been changing so quickly.

I do not have any special wisdom regarding these events. However, I do intend to lead the congregation in prayer, and I ask you to join me in those prayers. Every Sunday I intend to pray for peace and justice. I intend to pray for the immigrants. I intend to pray for the law enforcement personnel. I intend to pray by name for President Trump, Governor Walz, and Mayor Frey. I intend to pray that God would bless and guide each one of them.

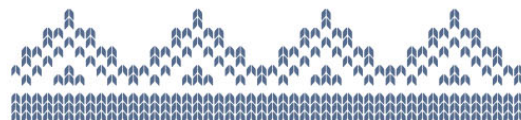

FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear members and friends of Mindekirken,

As my tenure as President of the Congregation comes to a close on February 8, 2026, I want to thank all of you who take part in the life of this beloved church. It has been an honor to represent you, and I am grateful for the support, encouragement, and thoughtful conversations shared along the way.

Having served on the Congregation Council for much of the period from 2004 to 2025, my love for Mindekirken continues to deepen. This is a place none of us own, but one we have all been entrusted to care for, each for a season. What sustains it is the steady dedication of people who understand that a church endures because its members choose to show up.

Whether you volunteer once a year at a favorite event or contribute more regularly, your efforts matter. Together, they make Mindekirken strong and ensure its future.

A reminder of that shared responsibility can be found at kirken's 1940 bronze plaque to right of entrance to the Nave. The names represent are those bondholders and noteholders who gave money to reduce the church debt. Between their generosity, 26-year leadership of Pastor Rasmussen and support by The Sons of Norway (Foundation) we are able to gather here today. This church is worth "fighting for."

In many ways, Mindekirken remains an old-fashioned church. The sanctuary may not always be full on an average Sunday, but we are rich in programming, fellowship, and community life. That abundance exists only because so many give of their time, talents, and care.

At its best, Mindekirken remembers what it is here to be. A church grounded in the Gospel, shaped by Norwegian language and tradition, and known for koselig warmth and hospitality. Our church is a place where people are welcomed not because they think alike, vote alike, or live alike, but because they are neighbors, families, friends, and fellow children of God.

Located in the heart of Ventura Village in the Phillips neighborhood, we are grateful for our neighbors who care for this church, attend events, and some become part of our congregation.

That shared stewardship gives me hope as I step away from this role.

TREASURER'S REPORT

At the cutoff deadline for the Communicator, I am still waiting for the year end reports to close out, so that I can determine where we ended up in 2025. I will be working on putting the budget together for the annual meeting which will be held on February 8th.

One analysis that I have done when looking at our numbers is that we have received a total of \$682,000 in the last five years from estate giving which is what has kept this church in the black. Our yearly expenses have exceeded the income taken in when we take the estate money out of the equation. This ranges in a shortage annually of between \$120,000 and \$146,000 between 2021 and 2024.

This has to be addressed as I do not think that we can count on estate giving into perpetuity. This will be taken up with the trustees this year.

CONGRATULATIONS!!

We are sad to know that Marilyn Sorensen, our long-time faithful leader of the Tuesday Open House program, is stepping down after twenty years of service. The program has grown in depth and attendance over these years under her leadership. Marilyn has had an abiding interest in Norwegian American history, especially the immigrants who came before the Restoration—going back as far as 1624! And in the Mormon movement among Norwegians in Norway and the United States. Her work for the Minnesota State Department of Education prepared her to lead the Tuesday Open House program. She had worked in four fields of education for the state: as a Special Education Consultant for the Visually Handicapped, the Physically and Other Health Impaired, Developmental Adaptive Physical Education, ending as the Assistive Technology Specialist for Handicapped for the Department of Education. She began as leader of TOH in October 2005 when Pastor Jens Dale left. Dale had written a framework for the program that made it more educational and scholarly. He had established the committee which helped advise the leader and enhanced the topics presented during the meetings. Marilyn, who had held three jobs at once, came to the position well trained for the work. She is most

proud of how the committee had enhanced its cooperation with the many volunteers who have worked together over the years. Under her leadership, the program has become one of the best of its kind in the congregation and the Norwegian American community. We will miss her leadership and commend her work with gratitude, and **we are happy to announce that Sandra Bestland will be filling the position. Thank You, Marilyn!**

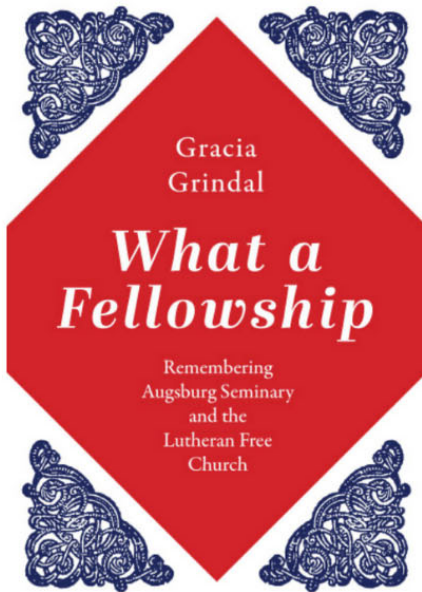

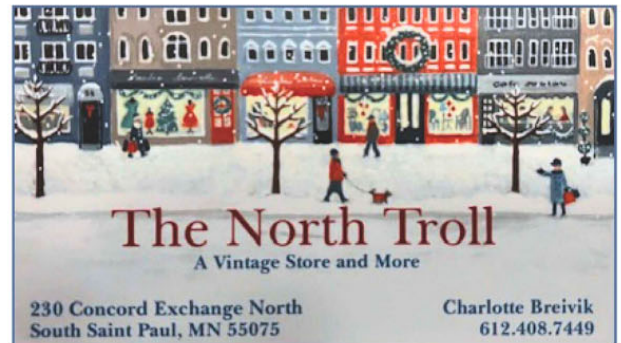

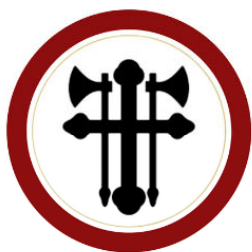
